When you give to Camp Hill UMC's one-fund for ministry, you are embracing *God's* vision of embracing children's ministries!

How, you ask?

Because of the EMBRACE Initiative, we are half-way through Phase 1 of our Children's Ministry Renovation! We have already paid out over **\$5,150** for new computerized child check-in technology, collaboration work with a designer, and new paint, so that our children's ministry corridor is well on its way to growing in the garden theme! **\$20,125** additional dollars are designated from the 2017 ministry resourcing plan to finalize the Phase 1 work of installing a new welcome desk, new murals, hallway furniture, and more!

Still coming in 2018, because of Embrace giving, we have also been able to allocate **\$40,000** additional dollars to begin Phase 2 of the Children's Ministry Renovation! Phase 2 will involve new carpet, cabinets, and paint for two of the largest, oldest and dividable classrooms in the Children's Ministry area.

Each Sunday, Camp Hill UMC staff and congregation members come alongside over 120 kids, as their hearts grow in love for God! We are so excited that these renovations will enable current families and those who are not here yet to grow in confidence leaving their children in our care in a hospitable, colorful, safe environment for sacred learning!

Children and Worship at Camp Hill UMC

9:30am – Sunday School is available for all, including children & youth ages 2 – 12th grade. 2 year-olds are found upstairs in Room 114. Youth are in the Chapel/Room 125. All other children are downstairs.

9:30 & 11am – Nursery is available for all infants through 4 year-olds in Room 116 during both 9:30am and 11am worship. We will reach you in worship through our paging system, if your child needs you.

11am – A Prayground is available in New Life worship for all infants through 4 year-olds and their caregivers. We understand that children worship through play and that for families to be able to worship together, sometimes a little more space to move around is required! One of our CHUM Children staff is always available, if needs arise on the Prayground, but parents and children are welcome to make their way into and out of it during worship.

11am – Create for Christ is a children's worship experience during the 11am worship service for children age 5 through 5th grade that includes both arts and crafts and music on alternating weeks. Children enjoy the first half of worship with their families in the Wesley Center and Sanctuary.
